- **REMINDER** for all High School Students: Week 33 (May 12, 2025) is the deadline date to hand in your paperwork for obtaining PE and/or Music credit for this academic year.
- For academic courses taken as Independent Study, please follow the deadline dates established by the Department Head.
- Summer Opportunities This is the time of year to begin planning! The University of Delaware's Edge Summer College Program is just one example. It offers rising high school juniors and seniors (ages 15 to 17) opportunities to enrich and expand their academic experience, including earning fully accredited college credits and living on campus for the 3-week summer session. Keep in mind, that you need to note the level of the competition (school, county, state, regional, national, etc.), the exact name of the competition, and the specific award earned (first place, honorable mention, meritorious award, superior ranking, etc.). For example: Second Place, Individual Exhibit Category, School-level National History Day Competition.

Strength would be my superpower, so I could keep working and feel good (and also be able to open a jar LOL)



Those who will be Sophomores in the fall are encouraged to take this test as a practice for the SATs. The PSATs are often used as a benchmark in assessing the student's readiness for scholarships, summer internships and/or volunteer positions. Likewise, those who will be Juniors in the fall are encouraged to take it in order to determine National Merit Scholarship status. Freshmen are welcome to practice their test-taking abilities but please be forewarned that there is a lot of algebra in the math section of the PSAT.










When: Monday, June 2 (8:45 am – 12:05 pm) and Tuesday, June 3 (8:45 am – 11:45 am) Where: Wilmington Community Evangelical Church, 1512 Brackenville Rd, Hockessin, DE 19707 Who:

- <u>All full-time Junior High students (grades 6-8) are required to test and will not be charged.</u> These students do <u>not</u> need to register. Parents, please see next page for service hour opportunities.
- Fourth through 8th grade siblings of full-time students, Towle 4th & 5th grade students, and junior high part-time students may test at a cost of \$30 per student. You do need to register these students. In order to ensure adequate tests and adequate space, you will need to enroll your child/children by Monday, May 5, 2025. Please complete the form at the bottom of this letter and return it to the school office. Enclose payment to Towle Institute for each child tested in grades 4 8 (who are not full-time Junior High students). If your form and payment are not received by this date, we cannot guarantee an available test for your child. There will be no registration at the door on the day of testing.
